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Minutes of the ORDINARY MEETING held on Wednesday 23rd March 2016

Meeting commenced at 7.55pm

Open forum Local residents wished to make representation about the recent planning

applications.

Scotwil

One resident read out a letter of objection that had been posted onto the planning application for Scotwil. In this letter was a comment that newts hibernate in the old wall that creates the boundary between the property and the road. This was from the daughter of the previous owner. Other comments made were about the number of properties on one site that constituted over-development of this site. Some residents asked for more information about the community site I.e. who will be responsible for it's upkeep. There was concern about the volume of traffic now using Jackson large as around \$55% of traffic entered the village via this road.

Lane, as around 85% of traffic entered the village via this road.

Meadowcroft

Comment was made that the 2 houses are too big for the site and that the gardens are on green belt land. The property to the South of Meadowcroft will be overshadowed by the gable end of one of the properties.

The Chairman thanked everybody for their comments and asked that, if they had comments, they should post them onto the planning portal site. He also pointed out that the planning application for Manor Farm (which had a few objections posted on the site) had now been withdrawn.

We were also given information that Glebe Farm, just outside the boundary of the village, has now got BT superfast broadband and are obtaining speed in excess of 20Mb. The Council will take this up with BT Openreach as it would not take much to bring the fibre into the village, even though we are not on their current plans.

Open forum finished at 8.15 and all the public left at this point.

It was noted that the land the bus shelter now stands on has not yet been signed over to the Council. The Clerk is to contact the Builder for an

update.
